ARTICLE 6: EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

Section (i) The Society shall be directed by an executive Council of five (5) Officers and eight (8) Councilors. The Officers, except for the President and Immediate Past President, and six (6) Councilors will be elected by secret ballot of all paid-up members, and two (2) Councilors will be appointed by the President. The Officers are: President, President-Elect, Immediate Past President, Secretary-General and Treasurer. The Councilors may be reelected for one further term after which they must stand down for a minimum of one term before being eligible for re-nomination. The Chairman of the Congress Organizing Committee for the international congress that occurs during the tenure of the New Executive Council will be an ex officio member of the Executive Council (without vote).

Section (ii) Nominations for the six (6) elected positions of Councillor shall be called for by the Secretary-General not less than six (6) months prior to a meeting of the General Assembly. Each candidate must be proposed and seconded by two (2) paid-up members of the Society, be members of the Society and provide written confirmation of his or her willingness to stand for election.

Section (iii) A nominating committee composed of the President (chairman), Immediate Past President and President-Elect shall propose two (2) or three (3) candidates for each of the positions of President-Elect, Secretary-General and Treasurer (see Section (iv) for an exception in the case of Treasurer). The candidates for President-Elect must have served previously as an Officer, Councilor or Chairman of the Congress Organizing Committee. All nominees must confirm their willingness to stand for office.

Members Society Reports:

1. American Society of Reproductive Immunology

The 27th Annual Meeting od ASRI will take place on May 14-16, 2007 at the Westin Harbor Hotel, Toronto, and will be Hosted by the ASRI and McMaster University. Plenary Sessions will include the immunology of infertility, endometriosis, viral and bacterial sexually transmitted infections, HIV, reproductive cancers, innate immunity in genital tract, new approaches to prevention of sexually transmitted infections, NK cells, pregnancy immunology, pre-eclampsia, fetal programming, male reproductive tract immunology, and translational research. The Abstract deadline is Feb 15, 2007. There will be poster sessions and some of the abstracts will be selected for presentation during the plenary sessions. Accepted abstracts will be available at the meeting and will be published in American Journal of Reproductive Immunology. 2. Japanese Society of Reproductive Immunology

The 21st Annual Meeting of the Japan Society for Immunology of Reproduction (Prof. Masahiro Itoh as chairman) was held in Tokyo on December 2-3, 2006. The scientific activities included two invited lectures, one symposium and luncheon seminar each and 48 oral presentations. The invited lectures were given by Prof. Charles R. Wira (Lebanon, USA) under the title "Immune Defense Mechanisms in the Human Female Reproductive Tract: Role of Sex Hormones in Innate Protection by Mucosal Epithelial Cells" and by Prof. Yoshinori Otsuki (Osaka, Japan) under the title "Apoptosis in Female Reproductive Organs? Especially, in Human Endometrium". The Title of the symposium was "Research Up to Date Surrounding Cytokine and Reproduction", which were presented and discussed by 6 invited speakers from various reproductive view points including spermatogenesis, ovulation, premature labor and endometriosis. The luncheon seminar was given by Prof. Hiroaki Shibahara under the title "ART and Reproductive Immunology". The oral presentation included various topics in biological and immunological studies on (1) Sperm and Spermatogenesis, (2) Ovary and Ovulation, (3) Fertilization and Pregnancy, (4) Fetus and Placenta and (5) Uterus and Fallopian Tubes, which were extensively discussed from basic and clinical points of view. The total number of attendants to the meeting was 211. The next 22nd Annual Meeting of the JSIR (chaired by Prof. Tatsuo Yamamoto) will be held in Tokyo on November 30- December 1, 2007.

3. ESRADI

The 4th European Congress in Immunology of Reproduction took place in Graz (Austria), 5-9th July, 2006. The congress encompassed 12 Oral Sessions and 3 Poster sessions. Almost 50 oral presentations (in 12 sessions) were given and 63 posters. Approx 150 participants from 20 countries were present, also from USA, Canada, Japan and India. Leading themes were: Gamete Immunology, Regulation of Implantation and Trophoblast Invasion, Materno-Fetal interphase - cellular elements and cytokines, MHC and Reproduction, Complement and Reproduction, IDO Metabolism, Mucosal Immunology, Placental Immunopathology, IFV and Stem Cells. It was carefully prepared Congress, one of the most representative in past several years, in Europe. At present, we are slowly approaching unification of different European movements in reproductive immunology into one organization. We hope to reach this goal during next European Congress in Reproductive Immunology, Berlin, August 30 to September 2, 2007.

4. AASIR

The XIth Symposium of Czech Reproductive Immunologists was organized and took place at Zdar Castle, on May, 2005 (international participants included -Prof. Lefkovits, Poradowska, Skamene, and Chaouat). XIIth Symposium of Czech Reproductive Immunologists was again organized traditionally in Zdar castle, in May, 2006. Prof.G. Dohr et al. organised the Graz meeting of Immunology of Reproduction, on July 5-9, Austria. The XIIIth Symposium of Czech Reproductive Immunologists with international participation will be held on May 24-27, 2007 (contact: Zdenka Ulcova-Gallova, Ulcova@fnplzen.cz). At present, the AASIR has 121 members.

5. The British Society for Immunology - Reproductive Immunology Group (BSI-RIG)

BSI-RIG is an Affinity Group of the British Society for Immunology for workers researching in the field of reproductive immunology. Its membership, currently standing at around 120, encompasses basic laboratory scientists, hospital clinicians and veterinarians. It holds regular meetings on all aspects of the field and particularly encourages presentations by young postdoctoral scientists and PhD students. These are usually half or one day symposia, held either in conjunction with the annual BSI congress or as joint meetings with other British or European events.

Two meetings were held in 2005. The first was a very successful one-day meeting at the University of Essex on 12th September 2005 entitled "Immunogenetics in Reproduction" in association with the 3rd European Congress of Reproductive Immunology. The programme consisted of invited speakers and a number of 10 min presentations selected from the abstracts (published in the American Journal of Reproductive Immunology) submitted by delegates. There were 95 participants for the whole meeting, from 24 separate nations, 77 of whom attended the RIG day.

A session on the "Comparative Immunology of Reproduction" was held at the BSI 2005 Congress in Harrogate on Wednesday 7th December 2005. The session brought together experts in reproductive immunology from human, mouse and veterinary species to compare and contrast the immunological features of pregnancy in different species and to discuss how that knowledge can be used to improve experimental design of models of pregnancy-associated diseases and the interpretation of data derived from those models. The meeting addressed to what extent data can be extrapolated from non-primates to humans and whether modern genomic and proteomic methods allow a better definition of the differences across species. The speakers were Lois Salamonsen (Australia), Peter Hansen (USA), Roger Searle (UK) and Elisabeth Innes (UK).

BSI-RIG are running a joint session, entitled "Innate and adaptive immune responses to microbes at mucosal surfaces", with the BSI Mucosal Immunology Group on Thursday 22nd February 2007 at the BSI Congress in Glasgow. The speakers are: Joost Oppenheim (USA), Vikki Abrahams (USA), Denise Kelly (UK), Duncan Maskell (UK), Tracy Hussell (UK), Catherina Svanborg (Sweden), Kevin Maloy (UK), Nils Lycke (Sweden), Zhou Xing (Canada) and Gary Entrican (UK).
